VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAMME IN DRIVING

Women Cell of Nirmala College offers a Vocational training programme in Driving to train female students and teachers during the last 5 consecutive years from 2015. Classes were given in both two wheel and Four-wheel driving. Timings for the sessions were fixed according to the convenience of participants, in the morning and evening hours. A private Training Institute which could provide the programme at a reduced fee is selected for the classes. The route covering 5- 10 km, in and around the campus were chosen for the classes, which was convenient for the participants. All participants who joined the programme acquired a valid licence. Department of Botany, Nirmala College offers a vocational training programme in Flower Arrangement. Topics based on Aesthetics of color and texture in floristry, plant identification, seasonal availability, unique floral displays etc were discussed in detail. Practical sessions on different methods of floral displays were offered during the classes. The training was focussed on skills and knowledge necessary for a professional floral design career position and to allow the participant to launch their own floral business.

Ms. Kitty Maria Sanil, Purple Rain, Ernakulam, a well-known florist and entrepreneur was the trainer for the programme. She demonstrated methods and various treatments to increase the shelf life of flowers. Using fresh flowers, students explored the basic concepts of flower arrangement while developing personal flair and creativity. Students learn tricks for creating sophisticated floral pieces to enhance any special occasion. The programme also integrated dried and silk flowers into design creation.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAMME IN ORGANIC VEGETABLE CULTIVATION

The National Service Scheme of Nirmala College offer a Vocational training Programme in oorganic farming in and outside the campus. From the year 2014-15 to 2018-19, training was given for a total of 1000 students in agricultural crop cultivation using only organic fertilizers and biological insecticides. They were given opportunities to prepare 60 cents of land for cultivation paddy and plantain. Vegetables like tomato, cabbage, cauliflower, cucumber, pea, chilly etc. were also planted inside the campus in an area of 40 cents. The programme was conducted in association with Krishi Bhavan, Avoly and also by taking advice from local experienced farmers. The organic farming programme was helpful in encouraging the young generation to bid farewell to the usage of chemicals in agriculture. Along with this the farming also created a renewed interest in agriculture among the participants.

OBJECTIVES:

- To provide awareness to students on the usage of organic fertilizers and biological insecticides.
- To engage students in the activity of farming and make them proud of the occupation which provides food for humanity.
- To familiarise participants in the process of agricultural crop production.
- To generate revenue through the sale of agricultural products.
