Sacred Grove Conservation Workshop And Biodiversity Documentation Programme At Nagappuzha

Brief Report of the Activity:

Members of Nirmala Nature Club devoted a day for the conservation of the sacred grove in Nagappuzha Santhukad Durga Bhadra Sastha Naga Temple on 30-01-2015. The temple and associated sacred grove is one of the eleven selected sacred groves by the Forest Department, Govt. of Kerala. The renovation of the sacred grove and conservation of associated flora and fauna was jointly done by the Department of Zoology, Nirmala College, Muvattupuzha, Social Forestry wing of the Kerala Forest Department, Temple management committee and a couple of neighboring schools.

The Management Committee of the temple in collaboration with Social Forestry wing of Kerala Forest Department and the Post Graduate Department of Zoology of Nirmala College Muvattupuzha organized a one day sensitization programme and field study to document the flora and fauna of the sacred grove in order to prepare a plan for restoring the old charm of the area and for the long term conservation of the sacred grove. A team of P G students and second year B.Sc. students and three faculties from the post graduate Department of Zoology attended the programme in 30 January 2015. In addition, students from the MKNM HSS, Vengallore participated in the programme. The programme started with a public meeting presided by Prof. V.S. Reji, Associate Professor, SN College, Nattika. Dr. Shaju Thomas, Rtd. Professor, Sri Anil K, Principal, MKNM HSS Kumaramangalam, Dr. Gigi K.Joseph, Nirmala College. All the speakers highlighted the need for conservation, people's participation in conservation and the commitment needed for restoring the past glory of the sacred grove. Dr. Gigi K. Joseph, Asst. Professor, Nirmala College took various sessions on current environmental issues and biodiversity conservation. It was followed by the Biodiversity documentation survey all along the nooks and corners of the temple premises. The students were glad to see the healthy saplings they planted few years before. In the mean time they could document the various types of butterflies, beetles, dragon flies, grasshoppers, spiders, birds etc. The identification of fauna was done with the guidance of faculty members like Dr. Vinod K. V., Ms. Jisha Jacob and Dr. Gigi K. Joseph. The one-day study resulted in identifying 16 species of butterflies, three species of Odonates, five species of other invertebrates, two species of reptiles, 13 species of birds and one species of Mammal. The recommendations were informed the authority.

Science Popularisation Project 2016

Conservation parks are becoming more and more popular themes for biodiversity conservation. Butterfly parks, bio parks, herbal gardens etc., are some of the conservation parks that can be set up for conservation and for generating conservation awareness. In the current programme, butterfly parks will be set up in the school / college campus since butterflies are ecologically and aesthetically very important so much so, they have been widely used in Zoos and Museums to promote environmental awareness. Captive breeding of butterflies both for exhibiting and for preparing curios and souvenirs is a major industry in several countries such as Malaysia, Singapore, Papua New Guinea, UK, USA and Canada. Butterfly houses are also becoming increasingly popular both at Zoos and natural History Museums as separate tourist spectacles and they have an important role in awareness generation among the public on the conservation of local biota. Butterfly farming enterprises are yet to be initiated in India because of the provisions of the Indian Wildlife Act, under which trade of butterflies or articles made out of them is prohibited. It is in this context that attempts were made to maintain butterflies in carefully landscaped gardens termed as "Butterfly Gardens", where the visitors can observe butterflies in their natural settings.

Butterfly gardening is designed to create an environment that attracts butterflies. Butterfly gardening is often aimed at inviting those butterflies and moths to lay eggs as well. Because some plants are not fed upon by adult butterflies, the caterpillar host should also be planted for a bigger population of butterflies. Butterflies typically feed on the nectar of flowers, and there are hundreds of such plants that may be planted to attract them, depending

on the location, time of year, and other factors. In addition to the planting of flowers that feed butterflies, other means of attracting them include constructing "butterfly houses", providing sand for puddling, water, and other resources or food items. The gardens established at Peechi and Nilambur were very successful attracting a large number of people particularly students. Establishment of a garden of flowering and ornamental plants with butterflies, bees and birds hovering the flowers is a novel idea and can form a theme of ecological and economic benefit under ecotourism programmes.

Objectives

To generate conservation awareness among students through participatory conservation ventures.

Method of implementation

In this programme, attempts were made to generate conservation awareness among students through theory presentations and hands on outreach activities by encouraging students to set up butterfly gardens / bio parks in their school / college campus. By setting up such parks, students got information pertaining to various life forms present in our ecosystem and also became aware of the need for conserving environment.

Periodical training workshops for teachers and students from all participating institutions were conducted. The Resource Person attached to this project gave classes on various aspects of biodiversity conservation and also helped them in setting up conservation parks. He was also helping them in identifying various plants and animals, record the citation of various organisms colonised in the parks due to habitat enrichment and also guide them in maintaining the parks.

Regular awareness programmes with the help of power point presentations were conducted in participating educational institutions mainly by the resource person and Principal Investigator. Field demonstrations and visits were regularly carried out in the participating institutions. Suitable Education materials, handbooks etc were developed and distributed to students who participate in the project. Student projects on butterfly diversity and abundance in the butterfly gardens were conducted by interested students in the respective institutions. Such generated informations were documented. Field trips to the nearby well organised butterfly gardens like the one in KFRI and Thattekkad WLS for selected students

Implementation Progress of the Project

The project was initiated immediately after receiving the first instalment of Rs 75000 form Kerala State Council for Science, technology and Environment, Government of Kerala on 9th December 2015. The Principal Investigator (PI) of the project had gone to the selected educational institutions in the Muvattupuzha educational district, briefed about the project outline and received consent from the institution authorities to implement the programme. It was followed by a project initiation meet in 14 December 2015. The teachers in charge of nature club / eco club along with selected students participated the programme. The PI briefed the objectives , methodology and brief outline of the project. Sites were identified for the establishment of butterfly gardens in the selected institutions.

Butterfly Garden Training Workshops

The first butterfly training workshop for teachers and students from all participating institutions was conducted on 17th February 2016. A total of 57 people including 17 teachers and 37 students from all participating institutions attended the training programme. Dr. Gigi. K. Joseph, the Principal Investigator, welcomed the gathering. Prof. P. C. Mary, Head of the department of Zoology presided over the meeting. The training workshop was inaugurated by Rev. Dr. Vincent Joseph, Principal, Nirmala College Muvattupuzha. The Keynote address

was made by Dr. George Mathew, Emeritus Scientist (Rtd), KFRI Peechi. Prof. Jose Karikunnel, Vice principal and Rev. Fr. Jose Pulparampil, Bursar felicitated the occasion. Dr. Vinod K. V. Asst. Professor, Dept of Zoology posted vote of thanks to everyone. The inaugural session was followed by the presentation by Dr. George Mathew with the help of power point to the trainees on the concept of developing butterfly gardens and its conservation. Frequent Interaction with the participants along with the presentation made it very lively. Finally a scheme was prepared for setting up butterfly parks through student participation. A field demonstration was also made in the Nirmala College Campus for how to design a butterfly garden in school compounds.

Establishment of Butterfly Gardens in institutions

Immediately after the training workshop, the students and teachers involved in developing butterfly gardens in their institutions. A small grant was given to every institutions to initiate the development of the gardens. Seedlings of host plants and food plants were purchased and planted. Students brought native host plants and planted in the garden. But the extra ordinary hot climate in the summer months was a challenge for the survival of many seedlings. At the onset of monsoon, the gardens started flourishing in the participating institutions.

A model butterfly garden was initiated in Nirmala College campus. An area if 10 cent area in the college campus was selected for establishing the butterfly garden. As per the guidance of the resource person, trails were made in the selected area for the garden. Fences were created around the garden so as to reduce external disturbances. Appropriate host plants and food plants were planted in the garden (Table 1.) Most of the plants were food plants which produce bright flower, honey and nectar to the butterflies. However many species perished over time. But successive planting of these species were vital in developing a good garden. With the establishment of these plants, gradually butterflies started coming in large number and stay back in the garden. Simultaneously a study on the diversity, abundance and their ecological relationships of butterflies were studied as part of the student project. The PI used to continuously monitor the development of such activities in those institutions. However it is a long term process to establish a fully developed butterfly garden. But in the meantime the students and teachers learn a lot regarding the biology, ecology and environmental issues regarding butterfly conservation

Butterfly sensitisation programmes

A series of butterfly sensitisation programmes were conducted in the participating institutions with the help of power point presentation developed exclusively for the concept. The presentation is very often covered different aspects like population statistics, biology, lifecycle, food plants, host plants, development of the gardens, maintenance and conservation issues regarding butterflies. It was generally followed by an interactive session. The garden visit along with the students and teachers also helped a lot to disseminate the various subtle features about butterfly conservation and environment conservation issues to them. Meantime the development of the garden was also being monitored. The butterfly sensitisation programmes were lead by Principal investigator, resource persons like Dr. George Mathew, Dr. Vinod K. V., Assistant Professor, Dept of Zoology Nirmala College and Dr. Shibin Mohanan, Assistant professor, Department of Botany, Nirmala College, Muvattupuzha.

Gardens in the participating institutions were visited by the resource persons and interactive talks were conducted with students in their garden. It helped them a lot for developing the garden in a better way. Leaflets featuring the development of butterfly garden was developed and supplied to every institutions. In addition to the leaflets, a copy of the Illustrated book on 'The Butterflies of Kerala' authored by Dr. George Mathew was supplied to every participating institutions. It can be readily used as a reference book for identifying almost all possible butterfly sightings in the school/ college premises and garden. In every institutions few students were selected for day to day data collection regarding the occurrence of various butterfly species in their garden. Students are keen to observe their host and food plants.




Road Safety Awareness Programme
