

ANNUAL REPORT OF SCHOLAR SUPPORT PROGRAMME CONDUCTED IN NIRMALA COLLEGE, MUVATTUPUZHA IN THE YEAR 2014-15.

Scholar Support Programme, initiated by the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Kerala as part of the 'New Initiatives in Higher Education' was launched in Nirmala College, Muvattupuzha in the academic year 2014-2015. The programme designed for providing additional support for students in curricular areas of weakness, targeted First and Second semester Degree (B.A./B.Sc/B.Com) students this year. The classes started by November 2014 and was successfully completed by March 31st 2015.

Selection of Subjects

As per the guidelines, 5 subjects were identified for SSP classes based on the Result Analysis Report provided by the Department of Higher Education and also by discussions done with teachers and students of various departments in the college. English, Mathematics, Economics, Hindi and Chemistry were identified to be requiring special attention. The corresponding papers of the above subjects from first and second semester Under Graduate Programme were chosen for the classes.

Selection of Students

Numbers of students who have secured less than 60 percentage of marks in the Qualification Examination were far less than the allotted 50 in the selected subjects. So based on the interests, marks and overall performance in the curricular activities, 47 students were shortlisted for SSP. 7 students for Hindi and 10 students each for English, Mathematics, Chemistry and Economics. The lowest percentage was 54.5 and the highest was 77% among selected students. The average marks of shortlisted students were 60.8 % for English, 64% for Hindi, 69.6% for Economics, 66% for both Mathematics and Chemistry.

Resource Persons

Resource persons for the SSP are the current faculty members of Nirmala College who are well experienced. The teachers engaging the classes are Ms. Ajomy Maria Joseph, Dept. of English, Dr. Meera. R, Dept. of Economics, Dr. Sreeja.G.R. Dept. of Hindi, Sr. EmyTomy, Dept. of Chemistry and Ms. Jincy Mathew, Dept. of Mathematics.

Classes conducted in First and Second semester

The SSP classes for the first semester were started soon after the completion of the admission procedure. Saturdays and morning hours of the working days were utilised. Attendance was maintained by the respective teachers for each hour. Out of the 15 classes 7 were allotted to first semester and 8 to the Second semester. Evaluation tests were conducted after classes which proved considerable improvement in the student performance.

Study materials, stationary kits and refreshments were provided to students.


Utilization of Funds

Funds allotted for SSP (Rs. 59,000/-) were received in the Principal's account, Nirmala College in the month of December 2014. 32% (Rs. 18,952/-) of it was spend before 31/12/2014 and a status report was send too. Rs. 50,666/- were spent before March 31st and the remaining unspent balance Rs. 8,334/- were returned to the corresponding Head of Account.



Suggestions

1. As the number of students requesting for classes in English is a quite higher than 10, an increase to 15 or 20 students may help in improving the overall results. For giving individual attention and to keep the advised student- teacher ratio, an additional faculty member may be selected.
2. Special training for the faculty members engaging the classes will improve the quality and effectiveness of the programme.
3. If a few classes be arranged around the time of University Semester Examinations, it may have a direct impact in improving the results.

The collective effort put together by teachers and students helped in successfully and effectively completing the Scholar Support Programme in Nirmala College, Muvattupuzha during the year 2014-2015.

REPORT ON SCHOLAR SUPPORT PROGRAMME OF THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2015-16, AS ON 31-12-2015.

NIRMALA COLLEGE MUVATTUPUZHA

The Scholar Support Programme, launched by the Department of Higher Education for improving the academic performances of students by providing additional curricular support, has been initiated in Nirmala College, Muvattupuzha in the year 2014- 15. Current academic year is the second year of the programme after its commencement. This year a total of 100 students were selected for classes in various subjects from the first and third semester Under Graduates based on their marks in the qualifying examination. 10 faculty members were selected too as Resource Persons of SSP.

The choice of subjects for the first semester students were English, Mathematics, Botany, Zoology and Hindi. Communication skills in English, Differential Calculus and Trigonometry, Cryptogams, Gymnosperms and Plant Pathology, Animal Diversity – Non Chordata and Functional Hindi and Technical Terminology were the papers identified as the ones which needed special attention. For the second year (third semester) students, the papers of difficulty in various subjects were Reflections in Indian Policy, Secularism and Sustainable Environment (English), Vector Calculus Differential Equations and Analytic Geometry (Mathematics), Advanced inorganic & organic Chemistry (Chemistry), Human Physiology and Immunology (Zoology) and Noting and Drafting (Hindi).

The first year students were selected based on the marks they secured in qualifying examinations. A few second year students who failed to secure the minimum attendance in the last year classes were replaced by other eligible students from the previous years' waiting list. For each subject in each semester, 10 students were selected which reaches a total of 100 SSP students in the current year.

For the first and second year students, a total of ten Resource Persons were selected from the faculty members of Nirmala College. For the first semester, the teachers engaging classes were Ms. Rose Mary P Jacob (Dep. Of English), Ms. Apsara Francis (Dept. of Mathematics), Ms. Chithra Jose (Dept. of Botany), Ms. Jisha Jacob (Dept. of Zoology) and Dr. Sreeja. G.R. (Dept. of Hindi). For the third semester students, Ms. Ajomy Maria Joseph(Dept. of English), Dr. Vinod K. V (Dept. of Zoology), Ms. Jasmine Mary P.J. (Dept. of Hindi), Sr. Emy Tomy, (Dept. of Chemistry) and Ms. Jincy Mathew, (Dept. of Mathematics) were engaging classes. Almost half of them were serving as the SSP Resource Persons in the previous year too.

Mr. Eldhose P Eby from the first year and Mr. Joshi Mani from the second year were selected as student co-ordinators for the year 2015-16 SSP programme.

Soon after the completion of the admission procedure, the SSP classes were started. Saturdays and morning hours of the working days were utilised for the same. Special attention on the semester examinations were given by arranging a few classes on days closer to the examination, expecting to help students in refreshing their knowledge in the subject more effectively. Attendance was maintained by the respective teachers for each hour. Stationary kits, study materials and refreshments were also provided.

The cooperative efforts and hard work of teachers and students of Scholar Support Programme in Nirmala College plays a key role in effectively conducting the programme during the past year.

ANNUAL REPORT OF SCHOLAR SUPPORT PROGRAMME CONDUCTED IN NIRMALA COLLEGE, MUVATTUPUZHA IN THE YEAR 2018-19.

Scholar Support Programme, initiated by the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Kerala, as part of the 'New Initiatives in Higher Education' was reinitiated in Nirmala College Muvattupuzha in the year 2018-19. The programme designed for providing additional support for students in curricular areas of weakness, targeted First year Degree (B.A./B.Sc/B.Com) students this year. The students were selected soon after the completion of the 2018-19 admissions and the list was submitted to the Director, Office of New Initiatives. The list was later revised as a few selected students were joined for other courses.

Selection of Subjects

As per the guidelines, a total of 5 subjects were identified for SSP classes based on the instructions and proforma provided by the Department of Higher Education and also by discussions done with teachers and students of various departments in the college. The choice of subjects for the first year students were English, Mathematics, Chemistry, Economics and Hindi.. The corresponding papers of the above subjects from first and second Under Graduate Programme were chosen for the classes.

Selection of Students

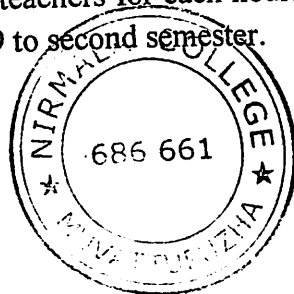
The first year students were selected based on the marks they secured in qualifying examinations. Analysis based on the proforma provided by the office of New Initiatives for the selection of the scholars were also followed. Performance of the students in class tests and evaluation of class tutor were also considered. Students who were discontinued to join for other courses were replaced by other eligible students from the waiting list. For the five selected subjects, a total of 40 were enrolled as beneficiaries of SSP in the current year.

Resource Persons

For the first year students, a total of five Resource Persons were selected from the faculty members of Nirmala College. The teachers engaging classes were Ms. Ajomy Maria Joseph (Dep. Of English), Ms. Meera Rose Joseph (Dept. of Mathematics), Dr. Sreeja. G.R. (Dept. of Hindi). Sr. Emy Tomy, (Dept. of Chemistry) and Mr. Shaimon Joseph (Department of Economics were engaging classes. Most of them were serving as the SSP Resource Persons in the previous years too.

Classes conducted

The SSP classes for the first semester were started soon after the co ordinators meeting. Saturdays and morning and evening hours of the working days were utilised. Attendance was maintained by the respective teachers for each hour. Out of the 14 classes for each year, 5 were allotted to first semester and 9 to second semester.



Stationary kits and refreshments were provided to students.


External Mentoring.

Utilization of Funds



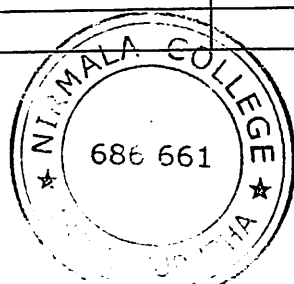

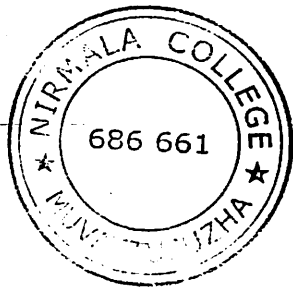
