Nirmala College (Autonomous), Muvattupuzha was founded in 1953 and it has now become one of the premier educational institutions in India with more than 3000 students and 145 faculty members. It is a Minority Christian institution governed and managed by the Corporate Educational Agency, Syrian Catholic Diocese of Kothamangalam, Kerala. The college is reaccredited by NAAC with A++ grade (CGPA 3.73) in the fourth cycle of accreditation in 2021. Presently UGC has conferred the Autonomous status from 2023 to 2033 for a period of ten years. The college has been continuously ranked among the best 150 colleges in the country as per NIRF Rankings. The college was ranked on the 91st position in the NIRF rankings 2017 by the Ministry of Education, Government of India and is also bestowed with the prestigious 'Star College' status by the DBT, Government of India. All Science PG departments of the college are supported by the DST FIST scheme.

In the dynamic landscape of higher education, our institution stands as a pivotal player aligning with the visions of the National Education Policy 2020 and Kerala Knowledge Economy Mission. In synergy with the mission's objectives, our institution is a knowledge hub that attracts students not only from within the state but also from diverse corners of the country. With an IGNOU Study Centre offering 11 UG and 04 PG programs and the Nirmala Civil Service Academy, we contribute significantly to the state's academic vibrancy. Our pool of 80 aided faculty members, including 43 Ph.D. holders and 32 research guides, epitomizes our commitment to academic excellence and research-driven pedagogy.

Renowned for its unwavering commitment to academic excellence, our college stands as a beacon of high standards and scholarly achievements. Over the past five years, our institution has proudly secured an impressive tally of more than 200 university ranks, a testament to the unwavering pursuit of academic distinction. In the academic year 2022-23 alone, the college further solidified its standing by securing an outstanding 68 university ranks in both Undergraduate and Postgraduate Degree examinations conducted by Mahatma Gandhi University. The campus is adorned with lush greenery and is located in the naturally blessed Nirmala hills which is spread over nearly 53 acres of land with state of art facilities for a constructive learning experience. ## **ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION**

1. Academic eligibility should be satisfied as on the closing date of application for admission. In the case of candidates who have passed examinations of other Boards / Institutes / Governments, except CBSE/CISCE, they shall be admitted only if these examinations have been declared equivalent to the qualifying examinations of MG



- University and on production of the same i.e., eligibility/equivalency certificate.
- 2. There is no age limit for applying to various UG programmes conducted in colleges affiliated to the University. However, the upper age limit for admission through sports quota is 25 years.
- 3. If an applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she had indulged in ragging, admissions shall be denied or she shall be expelled from the educational institution.
- 4. No candidate shall be admitted to the degree programme unless he/she possesses the qualifications and minimum requirements thereof.

### RESERVATION OF SEATS

### **Types of Reservation:**

Out of the total merit seats available in govt./aided/self-financing affiliated colleges for various UG programmes seats will be reserved for different categories under the following main items.

- i. Reservation for International Students
- ii. Reservation for nominees
- iii. Reservation for Persons with Disabilities
- iv. Reservation of Seats for Malayalee students from Andaman & Nicobar Islands:
- v. Reservation for Transgender candidates
- vi. Reservation for Ophan children
- vii. Reservation of seats for children from Government Children's Homes or Institutions coming under Juvenile Justice Act
- viii. PM Cares for Children Scheme
  - ix. Special Reservation and
  - x. Mandatory Reservation

### i) Reservation for International Students

10% additional seats shall be created in affiliated Arts and Science colleges over and above the sanctioned strength and added to the total merit seats exclusively for the purpose of accommodating international students. These seats shall not be filled up with other candidates. They can apply either on self or through the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) attached to the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India. The ICCR offers a number of scholarships to enable International students to pursue higher studies in Universities and other recognized institutions of higher learning in India. The international students (except Govt. of India sponsored scheme) are required to submit the application online (through admission portal www.ucica.mgu.ac.in) by paying the application fee of US\$ 100 (equivalent Indian Rupees on the date of payment) through international payment facility before the stipulated time attaching the following documents.

- a. Curriculum vitae.
- b. Copies of Degree Certificates, Pass Certificates, mark lists, transcripts of all examinations undergone.
- c. Proof for credibility of the University/Institution where the candidate has undergone the Qualifying examination including the recognition of the institution in Association of Indian Universities/Association of Commonwealth Universities/International Association of Universities or such accredited institutions of Higher learning.



- d. Two copies of recent passport size photographs.
- e. Conduct certificate from the Head of the Institution last studied
- f. Reference letters from two persons from respective countries, who have intimate knowledge of the academic capabilities of the applicant.
- g. Medical Certificate from competent Authority from the country concerned.
- b. Copy of Passport.

### ii) Reservation for Nominees:

An additional seat for each programme in affiliated Arts and Science colleges shall be created exclusively for the purpose of accommodating students sponsored by the Union Territory of Lakshadweep. This seat shall not be filled up by other candidates.

### iii) Reservation for Persons with Disabilities (PD):

5% seats of the sanctioned strength shall be created over and above exclusively for candidates with benchmark disability (as per clause 32 (1) of chapter VI, The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016). If candidates are not available in a particular category, the seats shall not be filled from any other categories. 'Person with disability' means a person suffering from not less than 40% of any disability as certified by a Medical Board constituted for this purpose. Candidates who have a minimum of 40% disability alone will be eligible for this quota. A relaxation of 5% of marks in the qualifying examination from the prescribed minimum is allowed. Candidates seeking admission under Differently Abled category should submit the "Certificate of disability", issued not earlier than 5 years prior to the submission of application, by the District Medical Board or bodies of higher status, certifying the degree of percentage of disability. The Permanent Disability Card issued by the State Government is also considered. Based on the details furnished in the online application, candidates will be provisionally included under the "Differently Abled" category. Candidates seeking admission under PD category should upload with their application form, an attested copy of the 'Certificate of disability' issued by a District Medical Board or bodies of higher status, certifying the degree or percentage of disability. The selection of candidates under this category will be based on the rank in the inter-se-merit list and not on the basis of the Degree of disability. No reservation of seat is allowed for Blind candidates for science subjects.

### iv) Reservation of Seats for Malayalee students from Andaman & Nicobar Islands:

An additional seat for each programme in affiliated Arts and Science colleges shall be created exclusively for the purpose of Malayalee students from Andaman & Nicobar Islands. This seat shall not be filled up by other candidates (U.O. No. 6199/AI/2016/Acad dated 23.11.2016).

### v) Reservation for Transgender candidates

Two seats shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength in all programmes



exclusively for admitting Transgender students. (G.O.(Ms)No.153/2018 HEdn dated 03.07.2018).

vi) Reservation for Orphan children: Two seats shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength in all programmes exclusively for admitting Orphan Children (Male-1 & Female -1). (U.O No.3149/ACA1/2024/MGU dated 08.04.2024). The students who seek admission in this category should first apply online and submit the print out of the online application to the colleges concerned along with a certificate from the revenue authorities that the candidate is an orphan.

# vii) Reservation of seats for children from Government Children's Homes or Institutions coming under Juvenile Justice Act

An additional seat in college shall be created for students from Government Children's Homes or Institutions coming under Juvenile Justice Act-(U.O. No. 5003/AC A 1/2021/MGU dated 25.09.2021& GO (Rt) No. 2484/2012/ H Edn dated 20/11/2012). The students who seek admission in this category should first apply online and submit certificate from the Manager of the Government Children's Home/ Institutions functioning as per Juvenile Justice Act where they have been residing.

### viii) PM Cares for Children Scheme:

5 seats shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength for children who have lost both of their parents due to Covid - 19 pandemic. Eligible candidates should produce certificate in proof of their claim from the competent authority (DMO/Tahasildar) in addition to satisfying their basic eligibility for admission to the programme (UO No. 5045/AcA1 /2024/MGU dated 12/05/2024).

### ix) Special Reservation:

The seats reserved under Sports Quota and Cultural Quota come under this category. The students who seek admission in this category should apply online. The admission shall be based on the revised guidelines issued vide UO No.2435/ACA1/2020/MGU dated 09/06/2020.

### Sports quota:

Two seats in each programme (Interchangeable) shall be reserved for candidates with outstanding records in Sports & Games. However, not more than 20% of seats reserved for the general quota seats of a particular programme shall be filled for sports quota when applying interchange ability for a particular programme. The applicant for admission to the sports reservation quota should have won a minimum of Third position (Bronze Medal) in the school sub district competition (inter-School) in addition to his /her satisfying the academic eligibility. Only the events which are having intercollegiate competitions in Mahatma Gandhi University alone will be considered for admission. Age Limit: Upper age limit for applying through Sports



quota is 25 years. The following guidelines shall be followed in determining merit in sports for admission to the U.G. Programmes. Marks shall be awarded for the Sports merit certificates as detailed below.

- a) The minimum eligibility for admission of a candidate to Under Graduate Programme (sports quota) will be winning a minimum of third position in the school sub district competition (inter-School) in addition to his /her satisfying the academic eligibility.
- b) Performance in any year during the Plus Two Programme will be taken into consideration.

- 4. Individual games /event means a game/event in which individual performs alone.
- 5. When a candidate has number of achievement in a sports /different discipline his/ her best achievement will be taken in to consideration.
- 6. All competitions where an upper age limit is fixed (Youth/Junior/Sub-Junior) would be treated as Junior event provided it is not classified as senior event by the concerned National Federation.
- 7. Priority will be given for students having achievements in senior level competitions than junior and youth category competitions.
- 8. Resolving of Tie: If the points of more candidates happen to be the same, then for breaking the 'tie', the following criteria shall be followed one after another in the order given below:
  - a. A person can score points only in one category.
  - b. The highest score will be counted
  - c. Where bracketed, scores in other categories will be counted
  - d. Where still bracketed, Priority will be given in the order of merit i.e.; 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place respectively.
  - e. Those with more number of achievements in the same level will be placed above the others (more number of 1st places, more number of 2nd places and so on).
  - f. Individual achievements will be ranked above team achievements.
  - g. A new record is created; he/she will be given priority. If the tie could not be resolved by any of the above-mentioned sports achievements, the index marks based on the qualifying examination shall be considered for breaking the tie.
  - 9. Performance in any year during the Plus One/Plus Two level will be taken into consideration.
  - 10. The students admitted in Sports quota shall mandatorily be available to represent the University in the Inter University competitions unless specifically exempted by the Vice- Chancellor/Director of Physical Education, Mahatma Gandhi University.
  - 11. For team events, colleges should upload the events they wish to choose in the beginning of each academic year
  - 12. If any discrepancy is noted during the verification of original certificates, the candidate shall not be considered for admission under sports quota.

NOTE: Those who seek admission through sports quota, shall apply online and upload necessary documents at the time of applying online. A final rank list shall be prepared after



the physical/online verification of credentials by the Committee chaired by the Head of Physical Education Department.

### **Cultural Quota:**

One seat for each degree programme (Interchangeable) shall be reserved for students who excel in Youth festival recognized by Director of Public Instruction (DPI). However, not more than 10% of seats reserved for the general quota seats shall not be filled for cultural quota when applying interchangeability for a particular programme.

Those who seek admission through cultural quota, shall apply online and upload necessary documents at the time of applying online. A final rank list shall be prepared after the physical/online verification of the credentials by the Committee constituted by the college.

If vacancies arise due to discontinuation of candidates under Sports/Cultural/PD quotas, the next eligible candidate in the Rank List shall be admitted. In case there is no next eligible candidate, the vacant seat shall be merged with the general merit quota.

### x) Mandatory Reservation

The seats for each programme will be distributed as per the existing pattern given below

### CLAIM FOR MANDATORY RESERVATION

Claims for Mandatory Reservations must be made by a candidate at the time of submission of application, with supporting documents as required. The claims for mandatory reservation once made in the Application form cannot be altered by the candidate under any circumstances.

Only candidates belonging to 'Keralite' category are eligible for claiming seats under Mandatory quota and Special reservation quota unless otherwise specified in the prospectus.

### i) Claims for Reservation under Kerala Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota:

Candidates claiming reservation under Kerala Scheduled Castes/ Kerala Scheduled Tribes Quota should obtain caste/community certificate from the revenue authorities concerned. The seats un- availed by the SC candidates will be diverted to ST candidates and vice versa. The un-availed seats reserved for SC/ST shall be re-notified twice through print media and a special allotment shall be conducted exclusively for filling up vacant seats of SC/ST candidates. If such seats are remaining vacant even after renotification, these shall be filled in the order as follows.

### ii) Claim of OEC candidates against the un-availed seats of SC/ST candidates:

Other Eligible Community (OEC) candidates who claim allotment to the un-availed seats, if any, under SC/ST quota should furnish community and income certificates/ non-creamy layer certificate obtained from the Village Officer concerned. Those OEC candidates whose annual family income is up to 8 lakhs (Rupees eight lakhs only) alone are eligible for such seats ((GO (MS) No. 03/2018/BCDD dated 09/04/2018.) They should provide



Community Certificate/ non- creamy layer certificate from the Village Officer concerned. In the absence of OEC candidates, the un-availed SC/ST seats can be filled from among the SEBC applicants.

# iii)Claim for Communal reservation under 'Kerala Socially and Educationally Backward Classes' (KSEBC):

Reservation to the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes will be in accordance with the provisions contained in G.O.(P)208/66/Edn. dated 02.05.1966, G.O.(Ms) No.95/08/ SCSTDD dated 06.10.2008, GO(MS) No. 10/2014/BCDD dated:23.05.2014, G.O.(P) No.1/2015/BCDD dated: 01.01.2015, GO(MS) No. 4/2015/H.Edn. dated: 05.01.2015, GO(MS) No. 15/2015/H.Edn. dated: 19.01.2015, GO(MS) No. 03/2018/BCDD. dated: 09.04.2018, GO(MS) No. 05/2020/BCDD. dated: 16.03.2020 and as amended from time to time and will be in accordance with the Orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India/ Hon'ble High Court of Kerala or Orders of the Government of Kerala/ Government of India. Candidates belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes as per G.O.(P) 208/66/Edn. dated 02.05.1966, GO(MS) No. 10/2014/BCDD dated: 23.05.2014, G.O.(P) No. 1/2015/BCDD dated: 01.01.2015, GO(MS) No. 4/2015/H.Edn. dated: 05.01.2015 and GO(MS) No. 15/2015/H.Edn. dated: 19.01.2015 should upload to the online application, a certificate to the extent that the candidate belongs to the community which is designated as a Socially and Educationally Backward Class and does not belong to the category of Creamy Layer, in the proforma given as Annexure V of the G.O.(P) No. 1/2015/BCDD dated: 01.01.2015. The noncreamy layer certificate should have been issued not earlier than 12 months prior to the submission of application. Only the claims of the candidates of those communities that are included in the list of communities appended in the Prospectus will be considered. Claims by candidates belonging to other communities, which are not included in the Annexure, will be rejected even if certificates from the concerned Revenue Officers have been obtained and uploaded to the online application.

1. Candidates belonging to Ezhava, Muslim, Other backward Hindus, Latin Catholic other than Anglo Indians and Other backward Christian communities, claiming reservation under SEBC Quota should invariably produce non-creamy layer certificate obtained from the Village Officer concerned. The self-attested copy of the above certificates should be uploaded along with online application. The seats unavailed by SEBC category candidates will be allotted under open quota.

### iv) Claim for Economically Weaker Section (EWS) category

10% of the total seats in *Self-financing Programmes* are reserved for applicants belonging to Economically Weaker Section. For availing the benefit of reservation under this category the



annual family income of the applicant shall not exceed the prescribed limit i.e. *four lakhs* as stipulated in GO (MS)No. 128/2020/H Edn dated 20/03/2020. For the limited purpose of reservation, under this category, candidates belonging to all those communities which do not enjoy communal reservation will be eligible vide UO No. 3047/AC A1/2020/MGU dated 07/07/2020. Candidates who wish to avail reservation under EWS will have to produce the *Income & Assets Certificate* from the village officer concerned.

### v) Other General Rules for Mandatory Reservation:

The seats unavailed by the SC candidates will go to the ST candidates, and vice versa. The unavailed seats reserved for SC/ST shall be re-notified twice through print media, and a special allotment shall be conducted exclusively for filling up vacant seats for SC/ST candidates. If such seats remain vacant even after re-notification, they shall be filled as detailed below: -

- a) The unfilled seats shall be filled by candidates belonging to OEC and, in their absence, candidates belonging to SEBC. The seats that further remain unfilled will go to the open quota.
- b) Claim of OEC candidates against the unavailed seats of SC/ST candidates: Other Eligible Community (OEC) candidates who claim allotment to the unavailed seats, if any, under the SC/ST quota should furnish community and income certificates obtained from the village officer concerned.
- c) The seats unavailed by the EWS category candidates will be allotted under General Merit.

### PREPARATION OF RANK LIST

The rank list shall be prepared on the basis of ranking marks arrived at as follows:

Handicap of five marks for every successive attempt after the first attempt subject to a maximum of twenty marks will be deducted from the total marks in the case of those who have taken two or more chances to complete the examination. The number of chances means the number of chances taken for passing any part of the qualifying examination after the prescribed programme period. Appearance for improvement of marks shall not be considered as an additional chance.

No handicap marks for SAY pass outs be imposed if admitted in the same academic year but five marks shall be deducted if he/she is ranked in the admission list of the succeeding year. Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination under SAY scheme or such supplementary scheme are eligible to apply for First Year programme in the same academic year, but they have to produce the mark lists on or before the closing date of admission as notified by the college.



### **Resolving of Tie**

If the index marks of more candidates happen to be the same, then for breaking the 'tie' the following criteria shall be followed one after another in the order given below:

- 1. The candidate who has scored higher marks in the concerned elective subject shall be placed senior in the rank list. For B.Com. Programme, business studies (commerce) shall be considered as the elective subject.
- 2. The candidate who has scored higher marks for part iii subjects (or the subjects other than languages, if part is not specified) taken together shall be placed senior in the rank list.
- 3. The candidate who has scored higher marks in part I (English if part is not specified) shall be placed senior in the rank list.
- 4. The candidate who has scored higher marks in part II (second language if part is not specified) shall be placed senior in the rank list.
- 5. By giving residential weightage (at district/state levels)
- 6. Preference shall be given to candidates who are elder, and the age difference shall be calculated in completed years only, rounding down fractions. (as candidates having difference in age less than one year happen to be admitted in the same class).

### **Bonus Marks**

The Bonus Marks will be awarded as follows:

- 1. Bonus of 15 marks shall be awarded to applicants with NCC or NSS Certificates at 'Plus TwoLevel' for admission to all programmes. In respect of NCC candidates, the bonus marks will be awarded on the basis of NCC Certificates signed by the Director and issued by the Directorate of NCC to candidates who have secured al least 75% attendance after having participated in its activities during the programme of study immediately preceding the programme for which admission is sought. An additional bonus mark of 5 to 'B' Certificate holders in proof of their high proficiency.
- 2. Bonus of 15 marks shall be awarded to Student Police Cadets for their participation at 'Plus Two Level'. However, such applicants should produce the relevant certificate from the competent authority in proof of their claim (UO NO.4999/Ac A1/2021/MGU dated 25/09/2021).
- 3. Bonus of 15 marks shall be awarded to applicants with "Rajyapuraskar/Nanmamudra certificate" in Scouts/Guides/Ranger/Rover at 'Plus Two Level' for admission to all programmes. However, they should produce the relevant certificate signed by the



Governor of the State for availing the bonus marks.

- 4. In respect of NSS candidates, the bonus marks will be awarded on the basis of NSS Certificates issued by the competent authority.
- 5. Bonus of 15 marks shall be awarded to the Ex-servicemen applicants and widows and children of Jawans and Ex-servicemen seeking admission to the Degree Programmes. Applicants to this category should invariably produce along with the application form an attested copy of certificate issued not earlier than six months from the last date of submission of application from the military authorities or state/Zilla Sainik Welfare Officer to the effect that he/she is the son/daughter of an ex-service man or an ex service man himself/herself.

The benefit of bonus marks can be scored by a candidate only under one category i.e., either NSS /NCC/Scouts & Guides/Student Police Cadets. Bonus marks shall be added only if the candidate has obtained the prescribed minimum qualifying marks in the qualifying examination while calculating the index marks.

Handicap Mark/s shall not be deemed as marks awarded for physical/mental disability of any kind of the applicant concerned. Handicap mark is the mark deducted from the marks of an applicant on account of acquiring the eligible qualifications in subsequent chances following the regular chance in which he or she ought to have acquired the eligible qualification.

### **HOW TO APPLY?**

## Nirmala College Muvattupuzha-Centralised Allotment Process (NCM-CAP)

Admission to Nirmala College is through a Centralised Allotment Process (NCM-CAP). There is only a single application form for admission to all the UG/Integrated M.Sc. degree Programmes offered by various departments at Nirmala College. If a candidate submits more than one application, his/her candidateship is liable to be cancelled. Candidates seeking admission to various programmes are requested to tick the relevant categories (Cultural/Sports/Differently Abled/SC-ST/Community/Management quota) along with



General Category / Open Merit. Along with the application form, the candidate must upload all relevant documents in support of his/her claim.

#### NCM-CAP involves

- i. Online Registration and Fee payment
- ii. Publication of rank list based on index marks after closing the application form (on the college website).
- iii. Document verification and taking admission based on the rank list
- iv. Commencement of classes

The schedule of all the admissions-related processes is published on the college website: www.nirmalacollege.ac.in.

### **Steps for Online NCM-CAP Registration**

- 1. For registration, the candidates must visit the website, www.nirmalacollege.ac.in and click on the link "UG Admission".
- 2. Register using basic details and student's valid mobile number.
- 3. Verify and login via OTP, and proceed to complete the registration.
- 4. Applications for merit/management/community/reservation category/others seats shall be submitted online only.
- 5. The community quota is limited to candidates belonging to the Syrian Catholic in the Kothamangalam Diocese only.
- 6. Candidates shall make sure that they fulfil the minimum eligibility criteria prescribed for the programme(s) under the relevant sections of the prospectus before filling out the online application. Please go through the admission criteria of the respective programme provided in the prospectus before filling out the application.
- 7. Fill in the application form with personal details, academic eligibility, and the options correctly.
- 8. Upload certificates and photographs in the prescribed format.
- 9. Ensure that all the fields in the application are properly filled in before payment of fees and submission of the application.



- 10. Application fee is ₹250/- for General Category, ₹100/- for SC/ST candidates and ₹100/- for Management Quota (extra). Application fee is non-refundable.
- 11. Pay the application fee by clicking on the "Fee Payment" button, which will redirect you to the Online Payment Gateway. You can use a debit card, credit card, UPI, or internet banking facility for making online payment.
- 12. The applicant can check his or her application status online at any stage after online registration.
- 13. Take a printout of the confirmation page for your future reference.

The correctness of information provided in the online application is the sole responsibility of the applicant. Hence, make double sure that all entries are made correctly before final submission.

### POST ALLOTMENT ACTIVITIES

### Reporting at the College for admission:

It is mandatory that all students who get allotment on the first option and those who wish to avail permanent admission should report for admission at Nirmala College Muvattupuzha. Candidates can download the allotment memo on the website through their login. Those who fail to do this within the stipulated date (published on the website) will be treated as not joined, and further claims for admission by these applicants will not be entertained.

However, candidates who wish to avail temporary admission to get higher options are exempted from reporting to the colleges physically. Instead, they should contact the college to secure temporary admission and confirm temporary admission. The college authorities, after verifying the digital copies of the documents provided online, may admit or reject the candidate, as the case may be.

However, the candidates who wish to avail themselves of permanent admission should produce the following documents in original before the principal or head of the college or institution at the time of admission itself.

- 1. The Candidate copy received online.
- 2. Certificate to prove date of birth. (10<sup>th</sup> Certificate)
- 3. Transfer Certificate (TC) from the Institution last attended and Conduct Certificate.
- 4. Mark lists of all parts of the Plus Two / equivalent examination.



- 5. Eligibility Certificate from Mahatma Gandhi University, in the case of candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from other Boards/Institutes/governments, except BOARD OF HIGHER SECONDARY EDUCATION Kerala, VHSE Kerala, THSE Kerala, CBSE and CISCE
- 6. Migration Certificate, if applicable.
- 7. Caste certificate in the case of SC/ST candidates. Any other documents required to be produced by the Head of Institution. (if applicable)
- 8. Community Certificate along with non-creamy layer certificate (as per Government rules) from the revenue authorities concerned in the case of SEBC candidates who claim reservation under SEBC category. The non-creamy layer certificate should not have been issued earlier than 12 months prior to the submission of application. (if applicable)
- 9. Income and Asset Certificate from the revenue authorities concerned as stipulated in GO (MS)No. 128/2020/H Edn dated 20/03/2020 in the case of candidates who wish to avail of reservation under EWS. (if applicable)
- 10. Candidates who wish to avail of bonus/weightage of marks shall produce the relevant certificates. (if applicable)
- 11. Community certificate from the revenue authorities concerned in the case of candidates who claim merit seats under Community Merit Quota (RCSC Kothamangalam Diocese only) category

The college authorities, after verifying the above documents, shall confirm the admission. The students who get admission to their first option should remit the fee applicable to the programme at the college at the time of admission. Those students who decide to seek permanent admission by canceling the higher options shall also remit the tuition fee and confirm their admission. Students seeking higher options after taking temporary admission need to wait for further allotments to take admission. As the allotment is based on the information furnished by the candidate online, eligibility should be confirmed at the time of admission based on the originals of the supporting documents uploaded by the candidate. Admission should be done by ensuring the correctness of the candidate's details. The candidates shall ensure that the colleges have verified their digital documents and records and have admitted them temporarily or permanently.
