#### Activity 1 - Road safety

The cadets of Nirmala College conducted a traffic awareness programme by distributing the traffic rule leaflets to the auto rickshaw drivers. The cadets where divided into five groups and send to various auto stands in and around Muvattupuzha.





#### **Activity 2 - Blood Donation**

Blood donation was organized by NCC unit of Nirmala College and Ernakulam Taluk Hospital blood bank. 55 cadets of Nirmala College participated in this activity. The activity was inaugurated Prof. T.M. Joseph, Principal Nirmala College.



#### Activity 3 - 'NAAN SANG' the Alumini meet of Nirmala college NCC cadets

The NCC Alumni Association of Nirmala conducted their get together at the Nirmala College on January 26 th with various cultural events, organised by the cadets of Nirmala College which were set to entertain the gettogether. 300 Alumini participated in this event.



#### Activity 4 - Online bill payment training to people in rural area.

To bring the awareness of online payment in day to day life and to promote the cash less transaction in the society. The cadets went to every house in the Avoly panchayath and distributed the leaflets that shows how to use these facilities. The cadets practically demonstrated the event to the people.







#### Activity 5 - Conducting A Certificate Examination at college.

280 cadets from various schools of the 18 k(bn) attended A certificate examination at the Nirmala College at 10th January 2019 . The exam was hosted by the Nirmala College NCC COY.

NCC cadets of Nirmala College, Muvattupuzha planted 500 jack fruit trees in the premises of Avoly panchayath. Jack fruit is the official fruit of Kerala. The fruit has medicinal values and is rich in protein and carbohydrate. It supports the environment by supplying minerals to soil and generating manure. Green Village Programme was supported by various youth organisations. Principal Dr. T. M. Joseph inaugurated the function by planting a tree. Prof. Gigi K. Joseph felicitated the function. All the cadets of this institution participated in this activity.



#### Activity 19 - Cleanliness Drive (Anicadu to Companyppadi)

#### Activity 21 - Waste management class

The class was given and idea on how to build cost effective vermin compost at home. Non degradable items and E waste posses' great hazard to the environment. He informed that plastic, the non degradable item can be recycled and used for road construction. He also said that the durability and safety of roads using plastic is good.



#### Activity 22 - Plastic free zone celebration and oath taking

NCC cadets kept separate waste bins in college for collecting plastic as a part of the plastic free zone celebration. Plastic thus collected was kept in a separate storage facility. It is torn into small pieces by using shredding machine in the college. It was aimed to use plastic in the road tarring at the college campus. The college community took vows to keep the campus completely free from plastics.

Rally started from Nirmala College and covered places such as KSRTC junction, post office junction, Kacherythazham, Nehru Park, Velloorkkunnam signal junction, Market road and Chalikkadvu Bridge by marching nearly eight kilometres.

On July 27, Nirmala, Muvattupuzha officialy started the youth red cross unit. Mr. MT Anil Kumar, RDO Muvattupuzha, had inaugurated the program in our audio visual hall. The welcome speech was given by Nirmala College NCC and red cross program officer Prof. Abin Wilson. College principal Dr. T.M Joseph had given the presidential address. Felicitation address was given by red cross chairman CV Paul Chathamkandam, Bijoy KV, vice chairman Jimmy Jose and red cross unit president Abel Babu. The blood donation campaign which was conducted by the NCC and Red cross unit had gained the attention of the whole college. Approximately 60 students donated their blood and showcased their participation in this great event. New volunteers were selected for the new unit. #### Activity 31 - Nirmala College Conducted The Merit Day Celebration

Nirmala College had celebrated the merit day on July 30 to honor academically excellent students. The event was inaugurated by MG university pro-chancellor Dr. Sabu Thomas. The NCC unit of Nimala College conducted the program. The chief guest was honoured with the Guard of Honour by cadets. Then the guest was lead to the diamond jubilee block accompanied by the NCC band. Parents of the winners were also present in the program. College manager Dr. Cheriyan Kanjirakkombil had given the presidential address. College Prinicipal Dr. TM joseph, Bursar Fr. Franics kannadan, Vice Prinicipal Dr. James Mathew and former Vice Principal prof. Jose karikkunnel spoke in the dias. Principal Dr. TM Joseph congratulated the Nirmala College NCC cadets for the event.









Nirmala college NCC cadets took part in hundreds of rescue missions and organised relief camp at college from 15<sup>th</sup> August to 19<sup>th</sup> August 2018. After the closing of the relief camp at college, cadets went for relief work at various places in Kerala from 20<sup>th</sup> August to 31<sup>st</sup> August 2018 and gave support for flood victims by cleaning the houses and public places, distribution of grocery, food and other necessary items at camps, distributing the compensation forms, chlorinating the water, conducting medical camp, distributing free medicines and giving counselling to the flood victims. In addition, the cadets are actively engaged in the preparation of a flood map of Muvattupuzha municipality. Detailed accounts of the activities undertaken by the cadets are as follows:-

#### Activity 32 - CAMP VISIT, RESCUE MISSION & RELIEF CAMP

After the Independence day celebrations at college, NCC cadets went to supply relief materials to the flood relief camps at Muvattupuzha municipality. They went to camps conducted at Kadathi, Kurian Mala, Govt.U.P.School Velloorkunnam Muvattupuzha, JBM school Vazhapilly, VM Public school and distributed food to the camp inmates .We were the first ones to distribute the food materials in those flood relief camps. People in these camps were relieved by the care that our cadets had shown to them in need. In the evening, as per the directions from Muvattupuzha RDO Sri.Anil Kumar, senior cadets stayed at college. Later we were informed to assist the civil administration in the conduct of 26 relief camps at Muvattupuzha taluk by sending 60 cadets to the camp.

At night, when the situation worsened, students planned for rescue operations in and around Muvattupuzha municipality and Avoly panchayat. In the midst of this, Junior U/O Abhiram went for donating the blood at Nirmala Hospital Muvattupuzha as per the information received from the hospital. When they came back to College, Nirmala Hospital Authorities requested us to help them in clearing the hospital and disconnecting the electric supply and switching on the hospital generator. A team of cadets went to the hospital and helped them in securing the hospital by evacuating the patients in the lower floor and switching off the electric supply. One of the cadets dived in to the flooded generator room and switched on the generator. At 9pm the NCC Officer Abin Wilson contacted the college Bursar for requesting the opening of Flood relief camp at college. College Bursar Rev. Fr. Justin Kannadan sanctioned the request and allotted the P.G Block of the college to conduct the camp. As per the direction of the college Bursar and ANO, the senior U/O Deepak .T.Kappen took control of the camp. Deepak along with the junior U/Os and cadets started the camp by midnight.

By 11 pm the government declared Red alert at Ernakulam district. During that time many of the cadet's houses were flooded. After saving the family members', cadets rushed to college for organising rescue mission. Senior U/O Deepak T. Kappen organised the rescue mission. Using social media and seeking support from the fire and rescue team at Muvattupuzha, cadets conducted rescue mission till 16 August 4am. During rescue the six member team of U/O Lijo Joseph, Aneesh.C.N, Bony George, Anto Mathew, Rahul Sajeevan, Abhiram Manoj got stranded in Vellorkunnam, the other side of the Muvattupuzha river. Due to heavy flooding all the roots to Nirmala College was cut off. Six cadets at Velloorkunnam were in charge of shifting the books at Muvattupuzha Muncipal Library, Vellorkunnam as per the directions from the Muvattupuzha Municipal Registrar Mr. Rajan. After clearing the municipal library cadets went to the 18 (K) Bn office at Vellorkunnam. There they met their colleague and NCC cadet Abel who was engaged in rescue mission. They continued the rescue mission jointly.













### Activity 33 - RELIEF CAMP, RESCUE MISSION AND STARTING OF COLLECTION POINT

The rescue mission was extended from early morning to mid night. On that day the team concentrated on the people of Kizhakkekara village who could not reach the relief camp due to flooded roads. Cadets helped the people of Muvattupuzha and people from other districts who were stranded due to flood at Muvattupuzha during their journey to home. There were 131 members in the first day of the camp including local villagers and people even from faraway places, other districts. The cadets took the responsibility of the safe arrival of members to the camp. They did a tremendous job in bringing the old and weak ones to camp. At the same time, SW cadets under the leadership of Junior U/O Athira James arranged the facilities for conducting of camps with the SD and SW cadets. They provided special care to the members who arrived at the camp. Different religious organisations like KCYM, Yuvadeepthy, parish committees, various political parties and NGO Organisations, former NCC cadets of Nirmala College, College Alumini and students of the institution helped a lot at the initial stages of the camp by supplying food, groceries and necessary components. A team of youth from Kaloorkkad Church bought food and initial supplies on the first day of the camp.

Another team under the leadership of U/O Lijo joseph, Bony George, Anto Mathew, Aneesh.C.N, Abhiram Manoj and Abel James took part actively in rescue missions held at Muvattupuzha town and Velloorkunnam. At Velloorkunnam numerous people were stuck on rooftop and second floor of their house due to sudden rise of water at night. NCC cadet Abel's father got trapped on roof top during the rescue operation. He was left there with other victims because water level was too high and under water current was strong enough to sweep away the rescue people. To rescue them we called the Fire and rescue team and they responded after 5pm. When Fire and rescue team arrived the NCC cadets joined them in rescuing the victims using the boat together they rescued hundreds of people. Two day rescue mission consisted of 187 rescue operations. College started a collection centre for flood relief under the direct control of NCC unit. 157 camp inmates were at the camp for the second day. Second day activities of rescue and relief camp was successful and peaceful.





### Activity 34 - SHIFTING PATIENTS FROM HOSPITAL TO CAMP AND ORGANIZING RELEIF CAMP AND VISIT OF RDO

Fearing more flood in coming days people came out of their homes and got shelter at college camp. The food, medical care and other facilities were arranged by the NCC cadets in an organised manner. The unity and discipline shown by the NCC cadets enabled them to conduct the camp in a smooth manner. Due to flooding, the hospitals at Muvattupuzha stopped functioning and discharged the patients. These patients discharged from hospitals were send to college camp by ambulance and by foot. NCC cadets went to hospital and took them on their shoulder and brought them to the camp. Cadets took great effort in carrying patients to the camp. People with serious medical illness were moved to Holy family Hospital Muthalakkodam and Chazhikattu hospital, Thodupuzha by ambulance.

The Muvattupuzha RDO visited the camp and supervised the camp arrangements. Thereafter, Health inspector and health supervisor of Avoly panchayath visited the camp along with a doctor. The large turnout of people at the camp resulted in a food shortage. With the help of NGOs, Student volunteers and various religious organisations we overcame the shortage for food. Ground floor class rooms were turned to Storage rooms. Materials such as groceries, sanitary napkins, baby napkins, baby food, bags, candle, medicines and old and new dress were kept in stock. Due to the excess of materials in the camp, a distribution centre was arranged on that day. There were a total of 191 refugees in the third day of the camp.





### Activity 35 - MEDICAL CAMP FOE PUBLIC AND CAMP INMATES ,VISIT OF COMMANDING OFFICER

As the water started receding out from the houses of refugees, many of them left the camp and began the cleaning process. On that day a medical camp was conducted for the locals in collaboration with the Chazhikkattu hospital, Thodupuzha. Many people came and utilised the opportunity. One of the refugees who suffered from jaundice was then admitted at Chazhikattu hospital, Thodupuzha. Disposible materials used in the camp prevented the contagious disease from spreading. The cleanliness of the camp was also commendable. The camp was visited by College Principal Dr. T. M. Joseph and Fr. Saju. K. Mathai - college Alumini and PTA executive member. A distribution centre started functioning from this day. First consignment was given to St. Mary's college, Thurithipally. Kadathi, Kurianmala, Vanitha centre perumattom, Pezhakkapally, Aluva, Paravoor (Ernakulam), Chenganoor (Alappuzha), Cheruthoni (Idukki), Chalkkudy (Thrissur) camps at these places were supported by the food and other necessary items distributed from the College camp. The commanding Officer of 18K (Bn) Muvattupuzha Lt. Col. Ranjith. R inspected the camp and congratulated the cadets for their service. DG NCC, Delhi tweeted about the flood relief camp at Nirmala College Muvattupuzha. This was the only camp in the state of Kerala which was under the control of a NCC Unit. By evening many of the refugees returned to their respective houses but still depended on the camp for food. On this day a total of 92 refugees were there in the camp.







### Activity 36 - LARGE SCALE DISTRIBUTIONS OF RELIEF MATERIALS AND WITHDRAWING THE RED ALERT IN MUVATTUPUZHA

The water levels in Muvattupuzha and nearby localities started decreasing rapidly. Majority of the roads were clear and ready for active transportation. Rest of the members at the camp showed willingness to go back to their homes. College Bursar Fr. Francis Kannadan addressed the people. ANO Abin Wilson thanked everyone for supporting the relief work. All the families were given a kit of groceries for preparing food for the next week, new clothes and bags. By evening refugees left the camp, but the materials for the camp were still pouring in and so we maintained the collection and distribution for another day. The materials were distributed to various camps at Aluva, Paravoor (Ernakulam), Chengannoor (Alappuzha), Cheruthoni (Idukki), Chalakkudy (Thrissur). On that day People from Malappuram who went home called us and thanked the institution and NCC cadets for their hospitality, care and affection.











### Activity 37 - DISTRIBUTION OF ALL THE MATERIALS COLLECTED AND CLOSING OF FLOOD RELIEF CAMP

Collection and distribution activity came to a halt when the rest of the materials were sent to other needy camps. By noon the cadets cleaned the college premises, class rooms, floors and arranged the desks and benches in the concerned classes. After cleaning the campus, the cadets moved to assist nearby residents who are affected by flood. They cleaned the houses there and helped the residents to calculate the loss to fill the compensation forms.


#### **Activity 38- CLEANING AT CHENGANNOOR**

Chengannoor was one of the most drastically affected area by heavy floods. By 21 of August the main activity around those areas were cleaning up the mess after the floods. The cleaning process was very hard in those areas. The buildings and infrastructures had become weak. The buildings were covered with mud from a height 1 to 4 feet. Various properties were damaged by the flood including electrical appliances and furniture. The cleaning process was also dangerous due to the presence of reptiles like snakes. A team under AKCC (All Kerala Catholic Congress) organized a cleaning activity at Chengannoor. Head of the team Adv. Biju Parayamnilam requested the assistance of NCC cadets from Nirmala College Unit. As per the request twenty cadets of Nirmala College Muvattupuzha went to Chengannoor. The team was lead by Deepak. T. Kappen. The team joined the AKCC group by 6.30 AM at Thodupuzha. After loading food and water and essential cleaning equipments the team set off to Chengannoor by 7 AM. The team reached

Chengannoor by 9.30 AM. The group under AKCC consisted of various members from Thodupuzha, Karimanoor, Karimkunnam and NCC cadets from Nirmala College Unit.

The whole team were split up into further smaller groups. The NCC cadets were also divided into 5 groups consisting of 4 members each. One of the teams cleaned the P.P.S .U.P school and the rest of the teams helped in cleaning local houses. Tremendous effort was needed to clear the mud and then take out the furniture's, bench and desk out of the class. Cadets cleaned the class rooms. There was no electricity and water available for cleaning but our cadets could able to arrange it and get things done. The team at P.P.S. U.P School had a tough task before them. All the Furnitures, Books and other materials at the school were not removed before the flood. Hence the complete building was covered with mud along with a lot of left overs and wastes. The main door of the school could not be opened at the first stage. One of the cadets climbed on to the second floor and got into the school through the upper door. He opened the back door of the school from inside. After getting inside the school the cadets concentrated on getting all the furnitures and materials out of the school. By noon the teams came back together for lunch. After lunch the second schedule of cleaning work started. In the second schedule all the cadets of NCC were allotted at the P.P.S U.P School, since the work there was too hard. By the approach of 20 NCC cadets the rate of work at the school became very fast. The cadets took out all the furnitures and cleaned them. Later they took the furnitures to the second floor. By 6 PM the team retured from Chengannoor and reached thodupuzha by 9 PM. Adv. Biju announced a second trip to chengannoor on August 26.





### Activity 39 - FORM DISTRIBUTION AND CLEANING PUBLIC PLACES IN MUVATTUPUZHA

Distress relief and compensation form was distributed to all registered flood victims in Nirmala College camp. Apart from this, the NCC Cadets of Nirmala College visited around 120 houses for the completion of the mission. NCC cadets gave awareness and guided them on how to fill the form and cleared their doubts about it. Cadets cleaned the houses near Tharbiyath School. NCC cadets analysed the flood areas and made a rough report about the flooding areas of Muvattupuzha municipality.









### Activity 40 - CHLORINATION OF WELLS AT AVOLY PANCHAYATHS AND MUVATTUPUZHA MUNCIPALITY

Cadets of Nirmala College went to Muvattupuzha for chlorinating well water, under the guidance of ANO Prof. Abin Wilson on 23/08/2018. They learned the process of chlorination and executed it. A group of NCC cadets under the leadership of U/O Athira James and U/O Alphonse Thomas went to Kizhakkekara for cleaning programme.

The chlorination is done in the ratio of 1000:5, that is 5g of bleaching powder is mixed with 1000 ltr of water. The bleaching powder is mixed with water to form a paste and then a half bucket of water is added to it. It is then kept aside for at least 10 minute. So that the clear water and the bleaching powder forms 2 layers and can be separate. The clear water is slowly dropped into the well and the water in the well is mixed thoroughly, this water is ready to use after one hour. The chlorination was done in about 20 houses. The programme was really appreciable. 35 cadets participated actively in the activity. They gave awareness to the public about water purification and cleaning.





### Activity 41- ONAM KIT COLLECTION FORM AVOLY FROM RESIDENTS AT AVOLY PANCHAYATH AND PACKING OF ONAM KIT AT RDO OFFICE

On 24th August the superintendent at RDO office called the ANO for sending cadets to pack the Onam kit. Thousands of Onam kits were arranged by the revenue authorities. Cadets filled the kits with enthusiasm. 18 cadets participated in that event. Under officer Lijo and 20 cadets went to collect the grocery items from residents of Avoly panchayath. Remaining cadets under the leadership of Abhiram. P went to High court to collect the cleaning materials that was distributed there.



#### Activity 42 - ONAM KIT DISTRIBUTION TO FLOOD VICTIMS ON THIRUVONAM

Cadets distributed all the pre - collected food items as a token of love on Thiruvonam to flood affected families . The kit contained rice, vegetables and other food items.





#### Activity 43 - SECOND VISIT TO CHENGANNOOR FOR CLEANING

The second vist to Chengannoor was scheduled on twenty sixth of August. Like the last time, cadets met the AKCC team at 6.30 AM at Thodupuzha. As per the instruction of the team leader Adv. Biju Parayamnilam, only 6 cadets took part in the cleaning activity, since there were more volunteers from Mission league and KCYM. The cadets were lead by senior U/O Deepak T Kappen. They reached Chengannoor by 9.30 AM. The cadets were given precautionary medicines and saftey equipments like hand gloves and masks. The team was split up into sub groups. The 6 NCC cadets were put together in a single team. They went to clean the anganvadi and kindergarten schools at Chengannoor. The team was actively and successfully in cleaned up 3 institutions. The work on the second day became faster and easier due to the increase in the total number of volunteers at Chenganoor. Proper power supply was restablished. In the evening by 5 AM the local

people gathered together at the nearby church and conveyed their sincere thanks to the whole team. On the return trip Adv. Biju Parayamnilam conveyed his gratitude on behalf of AKCC, towards the cadets of Nirmala College NCC.





#### Activity 44 - IDENTIFICATION OF FLOODED AREAS IN MUVATTUPUZHA

NCC cadets were assigned to draw a map to find and record the flooded areas of Muvattupuzha. It was then verified by the authorities before publishing. For this, the ANO went to RDO Office and collected the Official Map of Muvattupuzha. Flooded areas were identified along with flooding time and marked it on a clean sheet. Later the rainfall rate and rate of water released into the river by opening of dams was also taken into account.









#### **Activity 45 - FREE MEDICINE DISTRIBUTION IN FLOOD EFFECTED AREAS**

Free medicine distribution to flood affected people for preventing them from getting fever, typhoid etc. was undertaken. The medicine was given by the Govt. Homeo hospital, Muvattupuzha. The medicine distribution was focused on the people of Kizhakkekkara village and locality. A team of 30 cadets under the leadership of U/O Athira James and U/O Alphonse Thomas actively took part in the medicine distribution. The cadets briefed citizens about the intake of medicines and other precautions to be taken post flood.















#### **Activity 46 - CLEANING AT MUVATTUPUZHA**

Twenty NCC cadets of Nirmala College participated in Cleaning the walk-way of Muvattupuzha "puzhyoram". Puzhayoram walk way was filled with plastic waste and rubble. Cadets went there and collected plastic waste in separate bags so that it can be used for recycling. Gradable waste was collected and handed over to municipal cleaning staff. Fire and rescue team also participated in that event and encouraged the cadets. The station in charge thanked Nirmala College cadets for cleaning the waste on the walk way of Muvattupuzha puzhyoram.












#### Activity 47 - MAPPING OF FLOODED AREAS IN MUVATTUPUZHA

Kottayam Group Commander Brig. Sunil Kumar with 18(K) Bn Commanding Officer Colonel Kritik. K. Nair and ADM Officer Lt. Colonel R. Renjith appreciated the ANO Prof. Abin Wilson and the cadets of Nirmala College for the courageous services provided by them. The support and care provided by the NCC cadets during the flood situation earned the respect of the people. They consistently involved themselves in the rescue mission without even considering their own health.
